## 6 Correspondence

The Post Office, held in the village hall has closed as the postmaster resigned. The Post Office are looking to restore a service, maybe a mobile unit.

A request for a prize donation for the Upper North Tyne Group, which aims to subsidise events ie panto trip and summer trip, was refused. The parish council are not in a position to give out prizes.

7 Financial

The bank balance at 28 October was £12712.56. A summary of the accounts at the 6 month stage had been circulated. Lloyds Bank propose changing the PC account to a Community Account. The Community Account will charge an account maintenance fee of £4.25 per month. A Remembrance Wreath has been purchased for £20.00 and will be laid at the memorial on Sunday 11<sup>th</sup>.

- 8 Tennis Court A rather lengthy report had been received from CAN, regarding the relationship of the Tennis Court, The Croft and Village Hall with the Parish Council and the village hall committee. It was agreed to ask Tracy Morgan from CAN, to attend a meeting to simplify details in her report.

- 10 AO B Agreed to report a pot hole at The Barn, in Yarrow.

Apparently if a household wheelie bin gets damaged, it is the responsibility of the household to replace it.

As the refuse wagon now collects from Hawkhope Farm, it was suggested the bins for High Hawkhope be moved from Hawkhope Road, up there too.

Sadly Mr J Richardson, due to ill health, handed in his resignation from the parish council. He was thanked for his local knowledge and contribution made to parish matters. The appropriate notices will be posted for the vacancy.

Down at Donkleywood, on the roadside there is a bundle of rolled redundant barb wire, which could be hazardous. NCC would be asked to invesgtigate.
